



This season's colors move beyond tradition. Lemon Grass brings a soft start, while Brandied Melon and Bronze Brown ground the palette in warmth. Lyons Blue and Crown Blue introduce depth that feels both sharp and steady. Damson, Mauve Wine and Winterberry carry the richness of ripened fruit, while Poppy Red and Chili Oil strike with energy. Balanced by Vapor Blue and Bright White, these tones prove that fall isn't just muted neutrals, every shade is a season on its own.



WHAT TO EXPECT



This season embraces strength and subtle drama. Silhouettes lean sculpted with peplums, draping and curve-conscious tailoring defining structure and presence. The palette balances grounded warmth with striking depth, blending earthy browns, ripe berry tones and rich blues with jolts of citrus and airy neutrals. Textures like faux fur, velvet and fringe add movement and intensity. Mood-wise, designers balance a little goth with a refined boho evolution, pairing darker, poetic elements with nomadic ease. Elevated checks, animal motifs and bold color accents inject personality without excess. Denim steps into the spotlight again with all the cuts: baggy, straight, slim, updated barrel, flared, bootcut and mixed washes.



GivENCHY

Sarah Burton's inaugural collection for GivENCHY felt like a poised rebirth rooted in the atelier's legacy, yet sharply tuned to today. Drawing inspiration from Hubert de GivENCHY's 1952 debut, she embraced graphic simplicity and purity of form, yet infused it with modern understatement and precision tailoring. The collection featured sleek stretch-knit catsuits boldly stamped with the GivENCHY marque, and masterful tailoring that emphasized soft-strong shoulders, contoured waists, and generous trousers with elastic comfort. Burton's technical prowess shone in reverse-facing coats and dresses that revealed sensuous back details and unfinished linings, highlighting her McQueen pedigree in pattern-making.
